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#### Lesson 26

# The Nakaka and Nakakapang Prefixes

#### 1. Definition and use

Naka + ka and its variant naka + first syllable of the root, are adjectival prefixes indicating something or someone which is causing or producing what the root designates. This formula is used with most ma and um verbs. With mang-verbs, the adjective is formed by prefixing nakakapang to the root. The variant for this is nakapang/nakapan/nakapam + the first syllable of the root. Most feeling-verbs from the previous lesson can be converted to the nakakaform and its variants. The thing or person causing the feeling or reaction is marked by Set I markers. The pronouns and demonstratives used should also come from Set I. The person affected by the feeling or sensation is preceded by Set III markers. Set III pronouns and demonstratives are used to substitute for proper names and common nouns. Sometimes the word para, which can be translated as to or for in this kind of sentence, is added before the Set III markers. The thing/person affected is not always mentioned. Sometimes the Tagalog adjective is not translated as an adjective in English. You will see this in some of the examples in this lesson.

The adjectival prefixes in this lesson should not be confused with the present aspects of verbal able prefixes **nakaka** and **nakakapang**.

Literal translations will not be provided for the other examples in this lesson.)

It seems that the party you are going to is formal. You are even wearing a formal dress and lace gloves too!

It is difficult to see the soldiers in the forest because they are wearing camouflage.

# 4. Naka plus the root of certain verbs

The resulting adjective describes the condition, position, or state of being of people or things. The English translation ends with the suffixes *ing*, *ed*, or *en*.

Note also that some **ma-able** verbs take only the root of the **ma-verb** to form the able counterpart. Some of the gerunds derived from **ma-verbs** in this list are also irregular.

They took a long time in choosing the valedictorian because the two rivals in class are equally intelligent.

7. Akala mo hindi siya makapatay ng langaw, iyon pala ay nasa loob ang kulo.

You would think that he can't kill a fly, but as it turned out he is a wolf in sheep's clothing.

8. Makakapanalo ka sa paligsahan kung ganito ang gagawin mo.

You will be able to win in the contest if you do this/it this way.

# 7. Negative sentences

Able verbs cannot be used with the negative words **ayaw** and **huwag** but they can be used with **wala** and **hindi**. With **hindi**, the infinitive form of the verb is used if the sentence is expressing an action that is <u>on-going or is true for the most part</u>. Outside these two situations, the able verb is aspected in the regular way. Compare the following sentences using **hindi**.

1.	a. Hindi ako makatulog kung gabi.
	or: Hindi ako makatulog sa gabi.

I can't sleep at night./I can't sleep nights.

b. Hindi ako nakatulog kagabi.

I couldn't sleep last night.

2. a. Hindi siya makatulog kung maingay.

He can't sleep if it is noisy.

 b. Hindi siya nakatulog dahil sa maingay/ingay.

He couldn't sleep because it was noisy/because of the noise.

c. Hindi siya makakatulog kung mag-iingay kayo.

He won't be able to sleep if you will make noise/be noisy.

3. a. Bakit hindi ka makatulog kung nandiyan ang biyenan mo?

Why can't you sleep when (whenever) your parent-in-law is here?

b. Bakit hindi ka nakatulog nang nandiyan ang biyenan mo?

Why couldn't you sleep when your parent-in-law was here?

### Sentences with wala as indefinite

When wala is used with able-verbs in the doer focus, it means no one or nobody.

# Examples

1.	Walang makakapamilit sa iyo kung

Nobody/no one will be able to force you if you don't really want to.

 Walang nakakapagpuyat ng limang araw na sunud-sunod at maaaring maloko sila.

Nobody can lose sleep for five consecutive days for they might go crazy.

3. Walang nakapanood ng dula kanina dahil sa baha.

No one could watch the play earlier because of the flood

# 8. Sentences with may/mayroon as indefinite

When may/mayroon/me/meron are used with able maka-verbs, they mean someone or somebody or some people.

- Will somebody be able to go to the market later? We need a lot things/ stuff.
- 2. Mayroon bang nakapanood ng balita noong isang araw?
- Was someone able to watch the news the other day?

- Someone has already been able to win the fifty million (prize) in the lotto.
- 4. Me nakakapamahala na sa tindahan namin.
- Somebody is able to manage our store now.

- 6. Mayroong mas makakapanguna kay Waldo sa marathon bukas kung hindi bubuti ang pakiramdam niya.

- It is true that someone can lose sleep for three or four days but they become weak and they might get sick altogether/eventually.

# Ma-verbs, Object-focus

### 1. Use and Definition

One other class of ma-verbs focus on the <u>object</u> in the sentence. Like other **object-focus verbs**, the direct object or the goal is the topic and takes a **Set I marker**. Pronouns and demonstratives should also come from **Set I**. Most of the verbs in this section are **able-verbs**. We will call them **able-verbs** for short but the underlying meanings indicate *ability, availability, possibility* or *chance*. The English sentence may use these phrases to express these concepts, i.e., *can, happened to, managed to, able to.* Some verbs in the list below have other meanings and these will be given in the list. The other meanings are passive verbs in English. The **doer-focus counterpart** is formed by using the prefix **maka**.

### Important notes

For <u>all</u> able verbs, current and future lessons, the <u>infinitive form</u> of the verb is used with **kailangan**, **puwede**, and **maaari** to mean <u>can/able/will</u> be able to. Although **puwede** and **maaari**, by themselves, already denote ability to do something, they can be combined with able verbs without changing the meaning of the sentence. With the negative word, **hindi**, the infinitive form of the verb is used to describe <u>an on going situation</u>, otherwise, the future form of the verb is also used. To express the present perfect tense in the negative, the present form of the verb is used with **hindi**. By themselves, able verbs are given in the <u>future form</u> to mean <u>can/able/will</u> be able to. The English translation is determined by context. With **wala** and **ano**, the future form of the verb is used to mean, for example, "What can I do?" **Ano ang magagawa ko?** and "I can't do anything." **Wala akong magagawa**. Able-verbs are not used with **ayaw** and **huwag**.

The doer or cause of the action is usually implied or understood but it can also be mentioned, depending on context. The words *accidentally* and *unintentionally* need not always be mentioned in the English translation.

Please tell me stories about Europe. I haven't been to that place yet that's why I would like to know if it is really beautiful over there.

10. Maiiwasan mo siya kung talagang gusto mo.

You can/will be able to avoid him if you really want to.

 Nahubaran na niya ang pasyente kaya maaari mo na siyang paliguan. She was able to undress the patient so you can bathe him now.

12. Nasabihan na ni Carlos si Pepe na handa na ang mga kagamitan.

Carlos has told/informed Pepe that the equipment is ready.

### More examples

 Nahihirapan sa pag-akyat sa punong kahoy si Cesar dahil sa wala siyang matanganang sanga.

Celso is having a hard time climbing the three because there is no branch that he can hold on to.

14. Hindi pa mawawakasan ni Dante ang nobela niya ito dahil sa gusto niyang habaan pa ito.

Dante won't be able to finish/end his novel yet because he still wants to make it longer.

15. Wala kang masusumbatan sa mga nangyari dahil sa hindi talagang maiwasan iyon.

You can't blame anyone for what happened because that can't really be avoided.

16. Employee: Puwede ba ninyong madagdagan ang suweldo ko ng diyes porsiyento? Labinlimang taon na akong nagtatrabaho sa kompanyang ito.

Owner: Matataasan ko ang suweldo mo kung tutubo tayo nang malaki sa taong ito.

Could you increase my salary by ten percent, sir/ ma'am? I have worked fifteen years for this company.

17. Hindi na niya puwedeng mautangan ang bangkong iyon dahil sa marami na siyang utang doon.

I can raise your salary if we make a big profit this year.

18. Kailangan kong mabalikan ang bag ko sa bahay. Nandoon ang pera ko at lisensiya sa pagmamaneho. S/he can't borrow money from that bank anymore because s/he already owes them a lot.

19. Pumunta ka sa tindahang iyon at siguradong mahahanapan mo ito ng mga antigong gusto mo.

I have to go back for my bag/ purse at home. My money and driver's license are in there.

20. Ilang libong tao na ang nakakamayan ng kandidatong iyon?

Go to that store and you'll surely be able to find in it the antiques that you like.

21. Hindi kita puwedeng daanan/ puwedeng madaanan mamaya. or: Hindi kita madadaanan mamaya. How many thousands of people has that candidate been able to shake hands with?

I won't be able to pass by your place later./I won't be able to pick you up later.

# Ma-an/han/nan, accidental focus, etc

Like some other **ma-verbs**, **ma-an/han/nan verbs** have different meanings other than that denoting ability. Depending on context, the English translation may contain the words *happened to* or *managed to*. The idea may also denote something that was done unintentionally or something caused by accident. For the accidental focus, the doer is usually not mentioned and is simply implied. Oftentimes, the verb is expressed in the passive voice in English, i.e., *was closed/was cleaned*, etc. Below is a partial list of these verbs. The infinitive form of most of these verbs are stressed on the <u>first syllable</u>.
